## Phoning 101 or 999

Please feel free to give us a call using the details below:



Remember, in an emergency always call **999**. This is when you need an immediate response because

- a crime is in progress
- someone suspected of a crime is nearby
- there is danger to life
- violence is being used or threatened.

In all other circumstances, you should phone **101** for example:

- to report a crime that doesn't need an urgent response
- to give us information about crime in your area
- for general advice, information and feedback on police matters
- if you'd like to speak to your local police officer
- to find out about beat surgeries or other police events in your area
- to get an update on a crime if you have been a victim
- to arrange a visit by an officer.

**101** is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week across England and Wales. Calls from landlines and mobile networks cost 15 pence per call, no matter what time of day or how long you are on the phone.



If you are deaf, hard of hearing, speech impaired or deafblind you can also use the following:

- Emergency SMS **80999**
- Textphone (also known as Tynetalk) **18001 101**
- Police 24 hour Minicom **01962 875 000**
- Police 24 hour Fax **01962 874201**
- Non-emergency SMS **07781 480 999**

If you experience genuine problems using a telephone to contact the police, you may benefit from our Direct Contact Line. The dedicated number is available to pre-registered subscribers who want to speak to us when it's not as urgent as a **999** call. It connects you straight to a trained member of staff who can help with your enquiry. Speak to your local Safer Neighbourhoods team or ask a friend to contact us for details of how to apply.

If you have difficulty speaking English, our call takers can access interpreters who can translate your call.
